Dear Parents/Guardians:

First, let us say we hope you and your family have been safe and healthy these past few months as our community has been dealing with the COVID-19 virus. We appreciate students, parents, and teachers for their positivity, flexibility and resilience during these trying times. A big thank you goes out to Greensburg Community Schools food service employees for providing meals to our students throughout the spring and summer and to our technology staff for all the work they have done maintaining student and staff devices. Lastly, a huge debt of gratitude goes out to all of our doctors, nurses, hospital employees, first responders, and our local and state leaders for all they have done and are doing to keep us safe and healthy.

When we think about “school safety” many focus on the obvious: Are doors locked and secured, do we have enough cameras, what will you do if “this happens” or “that happens”? All of these are legitimate questions and concerns. A year ago who would have thought we would be in the middle of a pandemic that would affect our school community.

We are all concerned about the safety of our families in these challenging times. At Greensburg Community Schools our top priority is protecting our students and staff. As a school district, we promise to do everything reasonably possible to protect your children against any threat that may arise while they are in our care.

With the assistance of local, state, and federal resources, Greensburg Community Schools have developed operating procedures and guidelines to address the Covid-19 pandemic. These, best practices, will be in place for our return to school this fall.

Our safety and security preparation focuses on three areas:

- Planning and coordination for potential emergency situations.
- Training staff and students as well as conducting drills to practice our plans.
- Strengthening our security technology and infrastructure.

Our school district has spent considerable time, effort and resources in the planning and practicing of safety and security measures appropriate for dealing with major critical incidents. We continue to have very close relationships and strong lines of communications with our law enforcement agencies and all first responders who serve our school community.

Entry into and exit from all of our schools is restricted during school hours. All visitors must check in at the main offices, utilizing our visitor management software, and receive a temporary identification badge before proceeding into any of the buildings.

This school year, more than any year in the past, we need parents/guardians who bring their child to school or pick them up at the end of the day to adhere to our traffic flow patterns, drop-off and pick-up locations, and parking locations. We are expecting more vehicle traffic this school year than we have had in the past. Following our traffic patterns will provide everyone a smoother transition before and after school.

Greensburg Community Schools has a corporation safety team tasked with reviewing and updating safety plans that are practiced annually with every school employee. In general, each plan involves the designation of a building level safety team, evacuation protocols, shelter in place and lockdown procedures, designation of multiple evacuation sites, reunification planning, and resources for external assistance before, during and after an event.

Greensburg Community School Corporation safety plans have been audited and approved by the Indiana Department of Education Division of School Safety and have met all compliant directives set forth in Indiana Code and the Indiana Administrative Rules outlining school building safety planning.

School Resource Officers are assigned full time to our High School and Jr. High School. A School Resource Officer is present at Greensburg Elementary on a part time basis with hopes of expanding this role in the future.

Every school has a detailed plan for reunification of students and staff in the event of a major emergency. GCS will use our One Call System to communicate with parents and families in an emergency as well as local media to provide updated information. You can help by making sure your contact information is always current. Information may be updated through the parent portal at [www.greensburg.k12.in.us](http://www.greensburg.k12.in.us) or by visiting your child's school.

Communication is a two-way process, we encourage everyone involved with our schools to communicate with us if they have a safety concern. If you *See Something or Hear Something* related to school safety, bullying, harassment or any potential unsafe situation, please *Say Something* by reporting it to your child's school administrator, counselor or SRO.

As a school community, we are thankful Superintendent Tom Hunter and our Board of Education always puts the safety of our students and staff first.

If we can ever be of assistance to you, or your family, please do not hesitate to call or stop by our offices.

Thank you for your continued support and for entrusting the safety of your children to us.
